

## Parent Survey Results

Thank you to all of you who took the time to complete the Parent View Questionnaire. This provides us with really useful information about what we are doing well and also, importantly, how we could improve.

In total we had **141** responses which was fantastic! Thank you.

**99% of parents said their children were safe and well looked after at this school.**

**96% of parents said their child was happy at this school.**

**94% of parents said their child was well taught at this school.**

**93% of parents said their child makes good progress at this school.**

**91% of parents said the school is well led and managed and that the school makes sure its pupils are well behaved.**

## Whole Class Instrumental Lessons

Thank you to the RPSA who have agreed to fund whole class music lessons in **Y3** and **Y6** this term. These lessons, taught by experienced music teachers from Herts Music Service, were previously funded by the local authority. As a result of dwindling budgets, these costs have now been passed onto individual schools.

It was agreed that the money raised from the RPSA cake sales, in these year groups, would be earmarked for this purpose. The children love their weekly fife and ukulele lessons and now, thanks to the generosity of the parents in the school, this music provision will continue.



A few parents have asked why Class Assemblies have been moved to a Wednesday. The simple answer is that the governors requested it. Ultimately, the school timetable is and must be dictated by the needs of the school and the people in it - most importantly the children. The Class Assembly is primarily an opportunity for each class to share what they have been learning with the whole school. In this school, unlike in other local Primary schools, we invite the parents to attend - if they are able. Although we know parents endeavour to attend Class Assemblies, there are inevitably circumstances which sometimes make this impossible. As a result, there are always children who rehearse their lines and deliver them perfectly - not for their parents but for a different audience. This audience is the school community and it includes the Headteacher.
